

INTRODUCTION

We owe Allah (SWT) our **Creator**, the **Enabler**, for the grace of sparing our lives to be part of this year's convocation ceremonies. This 10th convocation ceremony is very unique, special and significant in more ways than one. It marks a milestone, being the 10th convocation ceremonies and importantly, it makes the last convocation that will be superintended by **Prof. Labo Popoola**, as the Vice Chancellor of this University. Indeed, this is his valedictory convocation ceremony as Vice Chancellor, as his 5 year non-renewable tenure will come to an end on the 4th of **November**, 2021. On behalf of the Visitor, the Chancellor, Council, Management and Students, I congratulate **Professor**, **Labo Popoola**, for his achievements in this great University in the last five years.

FELICITATION

I wish to congratulate our graduands, their parents/guardians and well wishers, for making successes out of your academic sojourn in this University.

Let me be quick to add that the attainment of degrees, as you have richly earned, is not an end in itself, but a means towards other ends. As you are aware, success is a challenge to harder work. The days, when we used to see the possession of a university certificate as a

meal ticket, are gone forever in our country. You should see the attainment as a pedestal to harvest entrepreneurial skills that you can deploy profitably, rather than to continue to chase after elusive white collar jobs.

In the same vein, I congratulate the three eminent Nigerians that will be awarded the honorary degree **honoris causa** of our university at this ceremony. **Gen. Alani Akinrinade** is a senior citizen who rose to the highest peak of his military career. He was a soldiers' soldier. **Dr. Kamoru Yusuf** is the Chairman of Kam Group of Companies, unarguably the largest producer of steel products in the North Central part of our Country and highest employer of labour in the area. **Alhaji Murthada Adeniyi** is one of the largest commodities traders in our country and the only black man on the Council of the Federation of Cocoa Commerce (FCC).

OUR SURVIVAL

The pandemic that unfolded like a thunderbolt in the early part of 2020 is still very much with us and the disruption of the way things used to be done are now leaving indelible marks on the face of our societies and the way we get things done.

The disruption caused by the pandemic is still affecting the academic calendars of tertiary institutions globally; however Osun State University was able to conclude its calendar for the 2019/2020 academic session, through the adoption of virtual teaching, learning, and assessment, which was further aided by the recently introduced Learning Management System (LMS).

The Council and Management of the University have made giant strides over the past one year in ensuring that the mission and vision of the Institution are realized.

We are aware that funding has always been a challenge in administering higher institutions, especially those that are state-

owned, however, at Osun State University, we have been able to rise above this challenge to carry out infrastructural advancement and human capacity building, all from the proceeds of Internally Generated Revenue, TETFund Support and philanthropy from well-meaning citizens and friends of the University.

To ensure that our students are in the best hands, especially the newly matriculated students, the Council approved the construction of a 104 capacity residential building across the six campuses of the University to ensure that newly admitted students settle into the University system seamlessly, and to reduce the risk of their falling under negative influences. All the halls of residence have been completed and put to use.

Given the prevalence of sexual harassment in our tertiary institutions, the Council also approved the training of Staff and Students on the prevention of sexual harassment which was chaired by a member of Council, Professor Abiodun Alao. This was done to educate staff and students to make the University environment free of all forms of harassments or any other unprofessional conduct. We have a sexual harassment handbook that has been made available to staff and students.

As I alluded to earlier, the tenure of our current Vice-Chancellor, Professor Labode Popoola would come to an end in a few months and we have already set plans in motion for the appointment of the next Vice-Chancellor in accordance with the provisions of our Establishment Laws. The only commitment the Governing Council under my watch has, is to enthrone excellence through a fair and firm process, comparable to best practices anywhere in the world. We assure all stakeholders that we have no personal interests to serve other than the best for our university.

To our graduands that have interest in entrepreneurship, the University has set aside a pool of funds from where you can apply for interest free N200,000 alumni loan, introduced last year by this

administration. This money can help you start-up a craft on a small scale and expand over time.

I charge you to be good ambassadors of the University and positively contribute to the advancement of the society. All eyes will be on you as graduates of Osun State University, therefore I implore you to make the University proud. Never forget your Alma Mater.

I will like to use this opportunity to acknowledge some of our benefactors: Apostle (Dr.) Folorunso Alakija, the Chancellor of Osun State University and her family; Late Mrs. Frederica Abimbola Omololu-Mulele, an educationist, lawyer and philanthropist; one of the members of our Governing Council, Prince Tunde Ponnle; among others, for being strong pillars of support to the University. It is in view of this, that I want to call on other good spirited individuals to emulate the philanthropic gestures of these great minds, by sowing seeds and partnering with the University to attain greater heights. We implore you to sow legacies, sow endowment, and sow into the lives of our students.

Finally, I will like to thank and appreciate the Visitor to the University, the Governor of the State, Mr. Gboyega Oyetola, for the confidence he has in the Council, to handle the affairs of the University with a free hand. Other State Governors have a lot to learn from your Excellency in keeping to the age old Yoruba adage that says "Ti a ba fi agbo fun Egunngun a gbodo jowo okun re".

Sir, your efforts towards the uplifting of the University are recognized and appreciated by every stakeholder, friend, and well-wishers of the institution. The Governing Council, under your decent leadership, is the type that any Vice-Chancellor would wish for.

I would also like to use this medium to acknowledge my colleagues, both academic and non-teaching staff whose unrelenting efforts have contributed immensely towards harnessing the potentials of today's graduands. The University is grateful to you for your dedication and resilience. Your efforts are well recognized and greatly appreciated. I feel very proud to be associated with you all in this business of positively shaping lives.

To the parents, guardians, families, and friends of our graduands, I say congratulations for being a part of, and experiencing this commendable feat. It is not an easy task to become a higher institution graduate, especially one from this great citadel of learning. We recognize and appreciate your direct and indirect contributions in making this day a reality in the lives of your children and wards.

Projecting the University's Convocations: Past, Present and the Future

This is the 10th convocation of this institution since the first one in 2011. I am very proud and glad to say that in my five years as Vice-Chancellor of this University, we have been able to successfully observe five convocation ceremonies. I consider this a rare privilege, particularly because each year, except in 2019, we had raging storms, which the Almighty God divinely stilled.

It would be recalled that in March 2020, the NUC ordered the closure

of higher institutions around the country, owing to the outbreak of the Novel Coronavirus Pandemic. The University quickly adapted by adopting the virtual methods of teaching/learning, assessment and evaluation, which ultimately led us to having our first virtual Matriculation and Convocation ceremonies ever. Immediately after the ease of the lockdown by the Federal Government, the University updated all its activities to run in a hybrid mode, hence the reason for making this 10th Convocation ceremonies hybrid. We have thus incorporated the virtual approach into our system, and are also ensuring that we continue to upgrade our *modus operandi*, in line with the realities and exigencies of the new normal.

We are aware that some students of this graduating set have already been called up for their National Youth Service. Asking such students to travel back for the purpose of attending the convocation ceremony would be rather tedious; therefore, we made plans to send their convocation kits via courier delivery services to their respective addresses at no direct cost to them. This move not only ensured that they were not alienated from the convocation ceremonies, but also saved them the stress and risk of traveling down. At this juncture, I will like us to kindly rise to observe some silent moment in memory of our students who lost their lives on their way to the NYSC orientation camp in Kaduna. May their souls find peace with their Creator, and may their families and all of us be consoled.

To maintain a practice of what has become the height of University convocations around the world, Osun State University will be awarding *Honorary* Doctorates of this University to three respectable and accomplished citizens of this country.

The awardees were carefully selected in line with the Keffi Declaration of the Association of Vice-Chancellors of Nigerian Universities (AVCNU), after due consideration and approval of the Joint Senate/Council Committee report on Honorary Degree Awards at the meeting of Senate which held on Tuesday, 17th August, 2021.

Madam Chancellor, the recipients of these Honorary Degrees are Alhaji (Dr.) Kamoru Ibitoye YUSUF, the CEO of Kam Holdings Nigeria Limited; Alhaji Murthada Adeniji ADEYEMI, the CEO Starlink Global & Ideal Limited; and General Alani Ipoola AKINRINADE, CFR, GCON, a retired Military General, a war time hero and statesman. On behalf of the entire UNIOSUN community, I hereby express our appreciation for your acceptance of the honour being bestowed on you all today.

Building a World Class University

Ladies and gentlemen, it is my pleasure to inform you that Osun State University which started its academic activities on the 21st September, 2007 clocks fourteen this year. Our position in the ranking of higher institutions in Nigeria improves yearly. From a rank of 37 at the beginning of this administration, UNIOSUN is now ranked number 29 in Nigeria. For a University approaching the middle of its second decade of existence, we have accomplished quite a lot. We have added to, and improved upon our undergraduate and postgraduate academic programmes, expanded and repositioned our infrastructure to compete with those found in leading Universities. We are currently issuing two certificates to our graduates: Certificate of selected choice of acquired entrepreneurship skills, and the certificate of the academic programme pursued in the University. Through our joint effort over the past five years of this administration, we have been able to consolidate on the efforts of our founding fathers and predecessors to usher Osun State University into an era of academic and administrative consistency. We are confident of achieving even greater feats in the nearest future.

Academic Growth and Development

The Visitor, and our cherished guests, the era of stale curricula is

already behind us. Any higher institution that fails to evolve runs the risk of being left behind. At UNIOSUN, we are known for being agents of positive change. We recognize the role that higher education plays in poverty alleviation, hence our zeal for academic growth and development.

Over the years, we have continued to examine our courses, improved upon our curricula, and initiated new programmes to further expand and enhance our academic landscape. Our undergraduate programmes have increased exponentially in number, as we now boast of sixty-six (66) of them, spanning the fields of Agriculture, Education, Engineering and Technology, Health Sciences, Humanities and Culture and Management, Law, Sciences, and the Social Sciences. The total number of our postgraduate programmes rose from forty-five (45) to eighty-six (86), which include the postgraduate diplomas (PGDs), Masters (academic and professional), as well as doctorates.

I am glad that all our programmes have been duly accredited by the NUC. These programmes include professional courses such as Accounting, Law, Engineering, Urban and Regional Planning, Nursing, amongst others which have further been accredited by their respective professional bodies. It is also worthy of restating, that our MBBS programme was fully resuscitated in 2018. With the UNIOSUN-Modupe and Folorunso Alakija Teaching Hospital (UNIOSUN-MOFATH) nearing completion, it is safe to say that our medical programme would become the torchbearer of medical education, Research and breakthroughs in this part of the world soon.

Continuous Access to Higher Education

Through the joint effort of the Management and the Governing Council, we have been able to adopt and implement a Learning Management System (LMS) for instant assessment and continuous engagement of students.

The University also created opportunities for scholarships, financial support, and opportunities to earn stipends while schooling. Our Centre for Open, Distant and e-Learning (CODeL) is ready and raring to go, upon approval from the NUC. This means that very soon, UNIOSUN would be able to provide opportunities to individuals to obtain degrees without going through the conventional admission mode, and from any location in the world through our Distance Learning Programme.

Through the support of notable figures, individuals, staff, and corporate organizations, we have been able to provide financial support to students of our institution who have financial challenges. I want to thank Professor Amos Popoola for initiating the Staff Volunteers Scholarship Scheme for the University's indigent but diligent students. Much appreciation also goes out to members of staff who have been contributors to this scheme. I pray that God in his infinite mercies would continue to enlarge your coasts and take care of your own children just as you have been making this sacrifice to positively impact the lives of other people's children.

In spite of the escalating costs of providing excellent higher education services, especially, one with stable academic calendars, we have maintained a stable fee structure since 2017. We have not increased our tuition fees since 2017 just to ensure that aspiring students pick UNIOSUN as their preferred choice of University.

The 10th Convocation

Like the previous convocation ceremonies, we would be awarding first degrees, postgraduate diplomas, postgraduate masters and honorary doctoral degrees in the fields of Agriculture, Education, Engineering and Technology, Science, Health Sciences, Humanities and Culture, Management and Social Sciences, and Law. Tables 1 and 2 present the breakdown of the first and postgraduate degrees and Diplomas, as well as the classes of the degrees.

The Visitor, Ladies and gentlemen, the total graduate output of the University for the 2019/2020 Academic Session is Two Thousand and Twenty (2,020), which is made up of One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifteen (1,815) first degree graduands, and Two Hundred and five (205) postgraduate degree and Diploma graduands. Table 1 summarizes the first degree graduands according to their faculties and classes of degrees, while Table 2 provides statistics of higher degrees and Diplomas.

We have thirty-five (35) in the First Class, representing 1.93% of the total number of graduands, Five Hundred and Forty Four (544) in the Second Class (Upper Division), representing 29.97% of the total number of graduands, Nine Hundred and Thirty-Seven (937) in the Second Class (Lower Division), representing 51.63% of the total number of graduands, Two Hundred and Eighty-Nine (289) in the Third Class, representing 15.92% of the total number of graduands, while Ten (10) made Pass representing 0.55% of the total number of graduands. The Postgraduate graduands are: One Hundred and Seventy-Two (172) Academic Masters, twelve (12) Professional Masters, and Twenty-One (21) Postgraduate Diplomas from different

programmes spread across the Faculties and the Global Affairs and Sustainable Development Institute (GASDI) of the University. Since our first convocation in 2011, the University has surpassed the 13,000 mark. At present, we have successfully graduated a total of 13, 856 students, which is a commendable achievement for a University in the middle of its second decade of its existence.

The Visitor, Sir, ladies and gentlemen, this year's convocation produced one overall best graduating student, a female. I hereby present from the Faculty of Management and Social Sciences, and the Department of Economics, Ajayi-Smith Semilore Ifedolapo, with Matriculation Number ECN/2017/0046. Her overall CGPA is 4.84. Accept my hearty congratulations on achieving this feat.

Capacity Building

The University recognizes the need to improve the overall efficiency of staff and students, hence the need for continuous upgrading and improvement of their capacities. It would be recalled that in October, 2020, this administration partnered with Digital Bridge Institute (DBI) to train over one hundred teaching and non-teaching staff of the University on advanced computer techniques, in order to enable them function optimally. In March of this year, we organized a training programme for staff and students of the University with a focus on sexual harassment prevention techniques that can be employed to avoid this societal menace (i.e. sexual harassment), and steps to take when sexually harassed.

Furthermore, in July this year, the University hosted the Partnership for Pedagogical Leadership in Africa (PedaL), to train over two hundred teaching and non-teaching staff of the University for the enhancement of their capacities, confidence, values and attitudes in order to adapt to innovative pedagogy online, and also in blended mode.

We have organized series of trainings, seminars, and workshops for

our staff and students targeted at improving their overall output. Between August 7 and September 4, 2021, our Entrepreneurship Centre organized a five-week entrepreneurship training programme for students of the University, with the vision to equip them with vocational skills that could become primary and secondary means of income generation to them. In conjunction with Opolo Global Innovation Limited, we also organized a 5-day workshop for selected students across all the colleges of the University to train them on Artificial Intelligence (AI). Related to this is our initiative and the establishment of UNIOSUN Digital Innovation and Business Hub (DIBUSH).

Through the Internal Learned Conference Programme, and support from the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund), we have been able to support the training of several members of staff at various local and international capacity building programmes at a total cost of Two Hundred and Forty-One Million, Five Hundred and Forty-Four Thousand, Nine Hundred and Sixty-Seven Naira, Ninety Kobo (N241,544,967.90). Staff members who have benefitted from this support include those pursuing doctoral training in Universities in Europe, America, Asia, as well as in Nigeria. The Governing Council has also approved five percent of our Annual IGR for dedication to research, while incentives have also been approved, effective from the current session, for scholarly publications in High Impact outlets.

Staff Welfare

This University prioritizes the welfare of staff. Over the past five years, we have made combined efforts to ensure that the welfare of our staff is neither compromised nor sabotaged.

Despite the negative impact of COVID-19 which ravaged the world last year, we continued to pay full salaries of staff on the 25th of every month. Between the last convocation and now, two (2) Associate Professors were promoted to the rank of full Professors, several Senior Lecturers to the rank of Associate Professors, as well as

several teaching and non-teaching staff members to higher cadres.

The University set up the staff health fund with a capital base of N10 million. The interest on investment is expended on the health needs of staff and their dependants. We also introduced the automobile and housing loan schemes for members of staff, repayable at single digit interest rates of 4% and 6% respectively.

In 2018, we introduced a 50% rebate programme for the tuition fees of biological children of staff members. This scheme supports the education of the children of staff members. This year, the beneficiaries of this initiative rose to 91 from the 67 reported last year.

Also, the screening of One Hundred and Thirty (130) male and female members of staff above 40 years of age for cancer (Prostate and Breast cancers, for males and females respectively) at the UNIOSUN-MicCom Cancer Foundation Centre took place. We have partnered with the Ministry of Health in conjunction with the Local Government Vaccination Officers to ensure that all staff and students of the University are vaccinated for the purpose of curbing the COVID-19 menace. I would therefore like to plead with everyone to take the vaccine, and thereby take responsibility for preventing this deadly scourge from spreading further. COVID 19 is real!!!

Students' Welfare

For the first time in the history of this University, this administration mid-wifed the very first Central Students' Union body to address the yearnings of students. The process followed a systematic leadership training programme over a period of three years to prepare these young ones for leadership. In May this year, the University management purchased a Toyota Sienna Space bus, and handed it over to the Executive of the Students' Union, for ease of operation of the Union. I want to use this medium to appreciate the executives of Osun State University Students' Union (OSUSU). In less than a year of its existence, the Union has been able to positively impact the lives

of the students it represents through series of trainings, workshops, debates and quiz competitions, as well as sensitization programmes organized on topical issues, including the dangers of cultism, sexual harassment, and drug abuse. It has tactfully intervened on several occasions to protect the image and interest of the University.

Similarly, the Students Union of the Faculty of Basic and Applied Sciences on Tuesday, 6th of April donated an 861 square foot shed furnished with 12 pieces of metallic chairs and 1,500 pieces of mini jotters to the College of Science, Engineering and Technology of the University for the use of staff and students of the College during their leisure hours. Students of Public Health also donated a brand-new photocopying machine to their Department. These are all reflective of lessons in leadership availed our students from time to time.

We have been arming our students with entrepreneurial skills, which can be deployed for their sustenance after graduating. The Entrepreneurship Centre, under the watch of Dr. Florence Yusuf, has done a lot to enhance the entrepreneurial talents hidden in many of our students.

To ensure that our graduates who maintain keen interest in entrepreneurship get the opportunity to start-up SMEs, we came up with an Alumni start-up loan scheme of N200,000.00 to be given to Alumni of this Institution who have bankable proposals. This loan, repayable over a period of five years is at an interest rate of just 1%. Last year, 20 Alumni benefited from this initiative, and presently, we have 21 applications being considered.

To ensure the safety of our freshers as well as encourage them to imbibe the University culture, the University built a one-storey, 104-bed capacity hostel accommodation facility across all our six campuses of the University. These hostels are overseen by competent and experienced Hall Wardens. It is worthy of mention that each of the six structures was constructed from our Internal Generated Revenue (IGR).

Recognitions, Breakthroughs and Achievements

Distinguished ladies and gentlemen, the University continues to set milestones through the conduct of its activities. The constitution hitherto drafted by past Student leaders for the operations of the students Union Executive and members was reviewed and adopted in a joint meeting of Management and Student Leaders. Management believes that the best minds in the University should be in Students Union leadership, therefore, having a good Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) was established as a criterion to qualify for contesting any position. This criterion evolved a potential first-class 400 level student of Electrical Electronic Engineering, Muideen Olanrewaju with a CGPA of 4.6 as the pioneer President of Osun State University Students' Union. The Executive was unveiled on 17 December, 2020. He is currently in the final year of his programme.

We may also recall that in June, 2020, the University unveiled her homemade sanitizing cubicles. In January of this year, we installed our mechanized sanitizing cubicles on all campuses of the University to further ensure that the COVID 19 pandemic is kept under control. This has proved to be a significant step.

Earlier this year, the NUC approved nine academic programmes for the University at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels. Among the approved programmes is B.Sc. in Radiography and Radiation Science, making Osun State University the first State University in South-Western Nigeria to run the programme.

Our SIWES class from the Faculty of Engineering has proved itself to be solutions providers. As part of the Students Work Experience Project (SWEP) under the SIWES programme, the students coupled and installed twenty-six (26) units of solar-powered street light for the use of the University at a minimal cost. These are being replicated on our other campuses. This laudable project reduced the cost of grid and fossil energy use in the University.

Our Matriculation Tree Planting Campaign which started in 2018 during which each matriculant must plant a tree seedling continued

this session with the planting of over 4000 seedlings of different tree species across our six campuses. This campaign is gradually greening up all our campuses.

Also, the five-year tenure of our Chancellor, Apostle (Dr.) Mrs. Folorunso Alakija was renewed on the 9th of March, 2021 by the Executive Governor of the State and Visitor to the University, Mr. Adegboyega Oyetola. The renewal of her tenure is welcomed by every stakeholder of the institution, as it affords her the opportunity to continue with her enviable exploits in advancing University education here and beyond.

On Wednesday, 31st of March, 2021, we unveiled the Atmospheric and Space Weather Research Facility on the main campus of the University. The facility was bequeathed to the University by the National Space Research and Development Agency (NASRDA).

It will be recalled that the first two sets of Nursing Science students of the University set a standard by passing all the qualifying examinations for professional Nurses at the first attempt. The third set of our Nursing students have followed the trail of their seniors by recording 100% success in the May, 2021 Basic Nursing examinations, even when the Council recorded 30% failure in the examinations nationwide.

In the second quarter of this year, the University signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Max Impact Global Ventures Limited for the construction of a One Thousand Five Hundred (1,500) capacity students' hostel complex on our main campus. This would supplement our 104-capacity hostel on the campus, and aid our quest to make the University fully residential for students. The foundation laying is part of this year's Convocation Ceremonies.

The University also donated relief materials to Widows and Orphanages across the State of Osun as part of the activities organized by the Council and Management to celebrate our Mother and Chancellor, Apostle (Dr.) Folorunso Alakija in a three-day event to mark her 70th birthday in July 2021. As part of the event, we had the

privilege of hosting Amina Mohammed, the Deputy Secretary General of the United Nations as the speaker at the Public Lecture in honour of our Chancellor, along with an array of eminent discussants including Dr. Dere Awosika, Mrs Ibukun Awosika, Pastor Ituah Ighodalo, Mrs Siju Iluyomade, Professor Bukola Oyawoye and Dr Olowogboyega Oyebade.

Our Parents Forum under the leadership of Justice Jide Falola met in August to rub minds with the Council and Management of the University. As usual the meeting took far-reaching decisions in order to further enhance the progress of the University.

The University organized and held a three-day annual retreat for the Principal Officers, Provosts, Deans, Directors, and Heads of Department at Ada. The retreat was aimed at preparing unit leaders for effective management of emerging issues in University administration.

As part of the 30th anniversary celebrations of our State, our Prochancellor, Mallam Yusuf Ali, SAN and a member of our Council, Prince Tunde Ponnle are being individually honoured by the State with the Osun Merit Award, in recognition of their distinguished contributions in their various fields of practice and community service. Similarly, our Chancellor, Apostle (Dr) Folorunso Alakija is being honoured by the State with a Legacy Award, in recognition of her contributions to Social and Economic Development of the State. We congratulate them.

Linkages and Partnerships

Osun State University has continued to explore partnerships and collaborations from across the world. This is because of our belief that it is only through such partnerships and collaborations that the University can project itself within emerging global systems of higher education. Besides, such collaborations and partnerships provide opportunities for our staff and students to work with the best

of their peers and to gain access to complementary resources, equipment, and knowledge.

Conscious of the above facts, the University sought the membership of the Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU). The ACU has over 500 member institutions in 50 countries across the commonwealth, with membership spreading across Africa, the Caribbean, Europe, North, and Central America, Oceania and the Pacific, as well as the South American regions of the world. I am glad to report that UNIOSUN is now a member of this reputable global body. The benefits of being a member of this body include the opportunity for staff and students to access grants, scholarships, fellowships as well as other international collaborations and partnerships, while enjoying all rights accorded members. We have also joined the Association of West African Universities (AWAU), while actively retaining and engaging our other partners such as Association of African Universities (AAU), West African Research and Innovation Management Association (WARIMA), the United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network (UNSDSN), among others.

The University reviewed and renewed the Memorandum of Understanding signed with The University of The Gambia four years ago, which will enable staff and students to continue to participate in exchange programmes, and consequently enrich the quality of teaching and learning of both institutions.

Between January and August, 2021, one of our top academics in the Department of Zoology, Professor Monsuru Adeleke won a grant from Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation in collaboration with Sights Savers (Nigeria and UK), Global fund/National Malaria Elimination Programme/NMR for onchocerciasis and Malaria vectors respectively.

We now have a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Nigerian Institute of Medical Research (NIMR) to establish a framework for coordination and cooperation that will facilitate the

conduct of cooperative activities in areas of mutual interest. For the purpose of the MOU, NIMR shall avail the staff and students of Osun State University with access to Laboratories and Facilities; internship programme; and award of fellowship. Similarly, Osun State University shall make available to the Institute and its research Staff: Adjunct Lectureship Positions, Promotion of deserving NIMR Research Fellows up to Professorial cadre of the University; and joint MSc and PhD degree programmes in areas identified by both institutions.

Benefactions/Appreciation

On behalf of the Governing Council, Senate, Advancement Board, staff and students, I will like to express my appreciation to the following benefactors who made financial and material donations to Osun State University over the last one year.

First, our greatest appreciation goes to God Almighty, the greatest Benefactor and our Creator, who in his infinite mercies has granted us a peaceful year since our last convocation, He is forever worthy of our appreciation. We believe that, with him, peace has come to stay in this University. Also, I thank the people and government of the State of Osun for giving us a University and allowing us to run it as a University should be run.

Ours is a lucky and blessed University, as throughout the year, we have had uninterrupted teaching and learning activities despite all odds. We shall never stop appreciating our Chancellor, Apostle (Dr.) Folorunso Alakija, her husband, Mr. Modupe Alakija and their wonderful family. I would also like to appreciate Interventions from the Federal Government through TETFund and the NEEDS Assessment Programme. We also received gifts of books and other materials from various donor organisations and individuals.

The Ifetedo Community through her Monarch, HRM Oba Akinola Akinrera, the Olubosin of Ifetedo sustained her support to the

University. Apart from the bequeathal of additional 20 acres of land for the further development of our College Law Campus, a state-of-the-art school building containing 12 furnished classrooms, laboratories, staff offices, a giant generating set, computer systems among others was handed over to the University this year. That structure will house the proposed UNIOSUN-International College of Science (UNIOSUN-ICoS) which is currently undergoing registration with the State Ministry of Education.

We appreciate the good gestures of the Prince Tunde Ponnle's Scholarship Scheme for Indigent but Diligent Students, Awards and Prizes by various bodies such as MicCom, Otunba Grace Titi Laoye-Ponnle, Layi & Toyin Fatona and TPL Remi Makinde. UNIOSUN Staff Volunteer Scheme, L.A. Salami Foundation, Osun Development Forum Texas, Cherubim & Seraphim Church, Segun Aina Foundation, MTN Foundation, The Late Emmanuel Idowu & Maria Ajike Areogun Scholarship Foundation and the Great People's Foundation for the scholarships granted to our students. We appreciate the additional support to the Candido Da Rocha Trust Fund by the Trustees of the Omololu-Mulele Foundation. We are equally grateful for the institution of memorial activities in remembrance of the pioneer Provost of the College of Health Sciences, Late Prof Taiwo Adewole which was funded by his family to the tune of N9,250,000. We appreciate all our host communities, particularly, their Monarch for the ambience that they have provided us to operate smoothly. We cannot but continue to thank our indefatigable and selfless Pro-chancellor and Chairman of Governing Council, Mallam Yusuf OlaOlu Ali, SAN for his continued contributions and donations to the University and in particular, the Law Library.
