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UNIOSUN EXCELS AT THE NUC RE-ACCREDITATION EXERCISE, RETAINS OPERATIONAL STATUS FOR 25 PROGRAMMES


The National Universities Commission (NUC) has re-accredited twenty-five (25)undergraduate academic programmes of Osun State University, Osogbo. This information was confirmed through a letter from the apex university regulatory body dated 14th April, 2022, signed by the Director of Accreditation for the Executive Secretary.

The University had presented twenty-five (25) undergraduate programmes during the accreditation visit of the NUC between October and November 2021, and the various teams had rigorously examined the University's quality and quantity of teaching staff, available facilities, budgetary provisions, among other criteria. The approval conveyed by the apex Commission had revealed that all twenty-five (25) programmes presented got reaccreditation statuses except one which got interim accreditation status.

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The programmes with full accreditation status are B. Agriculture (Agricultural Economics and Agribusiness); B. Agriculture (Agricultural



Extension and Rural Development); B. Agriculture (Animal Science); B. Agriculture (Agronomy); B.A. Islamic Studies; B.A. Philosophy; B.A. Theatre Arts; B.A. Yoruba; B.A. Tourism Studies; B.Sc. Anatomy; BN.Sc. Nursing Science; B.Sc. Physiology; B.Sc.(Ed.) Biology Education; B.Sc.(Ed.) Chemistry Education; B.Sc.(Ed.) Mathematics Education; B.Sc.(Ed.) Physics Education; B.A.(Ed.) English Education; B.Sc.(Ed.) Economics Education; B.Sc.(Ed.) Political Science; B.Sc. Entrepreneurship; LL.B Common Law; B.Sc. Building; B.Sc. Estate Management; B.Sc. Chemistry; B.Sc. Plant Biology; B.Sc. Zoology; and B.Sc. Sociology, while B.A. Linguistics and Communication Studies was granted interim. With this latest approval, the University has renewed its operational license to run the above listed twenty-eight programmes for the next five years and the last one programme given interim for the next two years when the Commission will revisit for another re-accreditation.



UNIOSUN ACTIVATES ACADEMIC COLLABORATION WITH A GERMAN UNIVERSITY



n fulfilling the University's vision and mission, the Management of Osun State University has activated a collaborative relationship with Bonn University, Germany in the areas of teaching and research. Bonn University is one of the leading universities globally, and the collaboration will enhance UNIOSUN's visibility and global ranking. The collaboration is aimed at engendering the production of well-rounded entrepreneurial graduates who will be capable of impacting positively on their environments while also being globally competitive. It is also expected to proffer solutions to some of the challenges bedeviling the academic world in particular and the human society in general.

The new collaborative relationship, which is operationally between the College of Humanities and Culture of UNIOSUN and Bonn University's Center for Dependency and Slavery Studies (BCDSS), was kick-started with a 2-day hybrid workshop jointly organised for students of both collaborating institutions between Wednesday, 30th March and Thursday, 31st March 2022 at the main Auditorium of UNIOSUN's College of Humanities and Culture, Ikire Campus.

In their addresses, Dean, Faculty of Humanities, Professor Rotimi Fasan and the Director, Department of Near Eastern History and Languages at the University of Bonn, Germany, Professor Stephan Conermann expressed optimism that the collaborative approach of the two ivory towers would help in strengthening the exposure of collaborating institutions' students and academics, while advancing

the course of knowledge. The Vice-Chancellor, Professor 'Ayo Clement Adebooye, ably represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academics, Research, Innovation and Partnerships), Professor Anthony Kola-Olusanya, congratulated the host institutions for the initiative and expressed hope that they would explore more opportunities for collaborative work. The Vice-Chancellor highlighted the importance of multi-disciplinarity anchored on the foundations of research and innovation in the academia.

Facilitators and participants at the workshop contended that the solutions to the myriads of challenges bedeviling the human society were inherent in the system. Participants also agreed that if those solutions were identified and put to use, contemporary African and global challenges would be easily surmounted.

One of the participants and a graduate of UNIOSUN's History and International Studies, Arogundade Nurudeen, spoke on the Political Economy of Electricity Generation, Management and Consumption in Southern Nigeria (1895-1982). He posited that over the years, the huge investment in the power sector and the failure of successive administrations to make the sector work had continued to dampen the hopes of Nigerians. Another UNIOSUN alumnus made a presentation on Religious Faiths and Responses to Indigenous Medicine in Southwestern Nigeria, 1960 till Date. He maintained that the link between indigenous medicine and religion is inseparable, but argued that there were gaps between religious adherents and users of indigenous medicine.

Other papers presented by participants from the College of Humanities and Culture, Osun State University at the workshop included: "Modernity and the Challenge of Environmental Degradation in Recent Nigerian Ecocritical Perspective", Novels: by Mariam Salaudeen; "Tunde Kelani's Yoruba Cinematoaesthetics and the Birth of Nigerian Cultural Renaissance in Saworoide and Agogo Eewo", by Oyeleye Olamiposi; "Child Marriage Trauma, Resistance and the Emergence of Heroines in

Contemporary Northern Nigerian Novels", by Elizabeth Erivona; and "The Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade and the Emergence of Proto-Feudal Lagos", by Temitope Fagunwa.

Earlier in his Keynote address, Professor Olukoya Ogen, a Professor of History and Fellow of the Historical Society of Nigeria, charged the participants of the workshop to keep an open mind to new knowledge as hitherto held beliefs and theories could be counter-productive in contemporary knowledge generation and application.




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

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

UNVEILS UNPRECEDENTED TEXTBOOK ON MEDICAL CONTINUES

he Vice-Chancellor of Osun State University, Professor Odunayo Clement Adebooye has unveiled an encyclopaedic publication on medicine titled Essential Textbook of Medicine. The book which was co-authored by 155 medical consultants working in teaching hospitals and Colleges of Health Sciences across the country was presented to the public on Wednesday, 30th of March, 2022 at Olagunsoye Oyinlola Auditorium. While unveiling the book, the Vice-Chancellor commended the authors for their selfless efforts, saying such efforts would definitely be useful not only to this generation





but also to the generation yet unborn. He charged medical practitioners to continue to live up to their medical oath as he called on lecturers to inculcate the culture of reading in students through exposure to books from various sources, including literature.

The Vice-Chancellor stated further that scholars of the olden days were taught how to read at the secondary school level by reading literary texts, adding that they were thus able to read and comprehend texts from other fields at younger ages. In his remarks, the Chief Editor of the book, Professor Christopher Alebiosu, said a total of 155 senior consultants in teaching hospitals in Nigeria contributed to the book, and they were challenged to publish the book because the two main books used in medical instructions were written by foreigners, which obviously did not factor the

peculiarities of people living in the tropics into the volumes.

Goodwill messages were delivered by the First Lady of Ondo State and Special Guest of Honour, Chief Mrs. Betty Anyawu-Akeredolu; the Royal Father of the Day, Orangun of Oke-Ila, Oba Dr. Adedokun Omoniyi Abolarin; Chairman, Board of Management, UNIOSUN Teaching Hospital and Special Guest, Professor Issac Adewole, who was represented by the Chief Medical Director of UNIOSUNTH, Professor Peter Olaitan. Other top dignitaries that graced the occasion were Director-General of the Nigerian Institute of Medical Research, Professor Babatunde Salako; Vice-Chancellor, University of Medical Sciences, Ondo, Professor Adesegun Fatusi; and the 5th Civilian Governor of Ondo State, Dr. Olusegun Rahman Mimiko.



MDCN'S REGISTRAR VISITS UNIOSUN AHEAD OF MB;BS ACCREDITATION FOR HEALTH SCIENCES

he Registrar of the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria, Dr. Tajudeen Adisa Bolanle Sanusi, visited Osun State University ahead of the National University Commission's accreditation exercise for the University's Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) programme scheduled to hold later in the year. The visit was held on Monday, 4th April 2022, to enable the Registrar inspect the existing facilities of the College of Health Sciences and advise Management



on the state of the University's readiness and steadiness for the exercise.

Receiving the Registrar in his office, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor 'Ayo Clement Adebooye expressed Management's happiness and appreciation for the Registrar's visit, which he said would further assist the University towards having an excellent outing and overall success in the upcoming accreditation exercise. According to him, pre-accreditation advisory visits are very important as they



enable experts and Management to rub minds together towards ensuring itch-free accreditation exercises.

The Vice-Chancellor informed the Registrar of the University's latest improvement efforts on the MBBS programme to include: the ongoing construction of a 500-capacity hostel for medical students through a partnership with MaxImpact Global Ventures Limited, the world-class Modupe and Folorunso Alakija Teaching Hospital currently nearing completion, the inherited old Ladoke Akintola University of Technology's Teaching Hospital, and a host of other inherited and newly acquired facilities for the smooth running of the College. He further assured the Registrar that the Executive Governor and Visitor to the University, His Excellency, Mr. Adegboyega Oyetola, had indicated the readiness of the State Government to support the University to ensure that the MBBS programme accreditation by the National Universities Commission became a success.

In his response, the MCDN Registrar, Dr. T. A. B. Sanusi thanked the Vice-Chancellor and Management for the warm

reception accorded him. He assured the Management of his full support towards the exercise, and promised that he would inspect what the University had on ground and advise in accordance with standard practices. Dr. Sanusi seized the opportunity to commend the Chancellor, Apostle (Dr) Folorunso Alakija, for her philanthropic gesture towards improved healthcare education and delivery with her donation of a monumental edifice for use as teaching hospital in the University. In his words "I went to inspect the UNIOSUN Modupe and Folorunso Alakija Teaching Hospital (UNIOSUN-MOFATH) with my own eyes the last time I was here and the structure I saw was world-class. I can only imagine how it would look now as it nears completion. That structure should serve three purposes to the University: training, research and healthcare delivery." He further submitted that "The philanthropy of Apostle (Dr.) Alakija should send signals to other well-to-do and influential Nigerians living in opulence to make meaningful impact in other sectors of the economy".

The Vice-chancellor, Professor 'Ayo Clement Adebooye on Friday, 29th of April, 2022 charged the newly matriculated part-time degree students of the University to be diligent, honest and focused to be able to consistently maintain good academic standing throughout their sojourn in the University

Professor Adebooye made this charge while delivering his address at the 7th matriculation ceremony for part-time degree students of the University under its Center for Human Resource Development and Lifelong Learning (CHRDLL) held at the University's main campus in Osogbo. He further beseeched the Matriculants to positively project the image of the University as doing otherwise could be to their detriment.

"In your pursuit to realise your dreams, bear in mind that the hallmarks of academics worldwide include honesty, integrity and the pursuit of truth by honourable means. The honour code is a very important part of our culture, which says that we trust you to do what you do by honest means. Therefore, cheating in order to achieve your goals goes completely against that culture. I say this at this very early stage, so that you are aware that dishonest behaviours such as plagiarism and cheating in examinations are unacceptable and will not be tolerated.

"I want to appeal to you to make a conscious effort to be part of the process of building a community of people who love one another, support one another, and work together to ensure corporate excellence. Above all, I admonish you to stay away from, and protect one another against patterns of behaviour and social practices that are not consistent with the values we espouse and promote and, specifically, to have no tolerance for such practices as cultism, corruption, examination misconduct, drug abuse, etc.," Professor Adebooye said.

The Director of CHRDLL, Professor Elijah Agbaje presented the matriculating students before the University, while the Administrative Secretary of the Centre, Mr. Oladeji Abokede administered the Matriculation Oath to the students.

he pioneer Vice-Chancellor of the newly established Federal University of Health Sciences, Ila Orangun, Professor Akeem Olawale Lasisi, led other principal officers of the University on a courtesy visit to the Vice-Chancellor and Management of Osun State University on Thursday, 7th April, 2022. It will be recalled that the Federal Government approved the establishment of four new specialised universities including the Federal University of Health Sciences, Ila Orangun in June 2021.

Professor Lasisi congratulated the Vice-Chancellor of Osun State University, Professor 'Ayo Clement Adebooye, on his appointment as the Vice-Chancellor earlier in the year, and wished him an excellent tenure in office. He noted that as a new university, the visit became imperative to familiarise the Management of the new university with the leadership of existing universities in the same state, prominent among which is Osun State University. He noted that it is a standard practice for newly established universities to form alliances with similar institutions in their neighbourhood for academic collaboration, moreso as such institutions have some





programmes in common. He assured the leadership of Osun State University under the distinguished Vice-Chancellorship of Professor O. C. Adebooye of the willingness and eagerness of his team to engage in crossfertilization of ideas and to learn from UNIOSUN's College of Health Sciences.

In his response, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor 'Ayo Clement Adebooye, welcomed the Vice-Chancellor and Management team of the Federal University of Health Sciences, Ila Orangun to Osun State University and felicitated with them, first on the establishment of the specialised university by the Federal Government, and then on their appointment as pioneer principal officers of the University. UNIOSUN GASDI Hosts Webinar On International SECURITY ...As VC adjures world powers

to employ diplomacy over war he Global Affairs and Sustainable Development Institute (GASDI) of Osun

State University hosted a webinar on international security on Thursday, 7th April, 2022.

Themed "Sanctions and International Security: Russia's War in Ukraine, Western Democracies and Global Peace", the webinar had a notable American political scientist, Professor Thomas Biersteker of the Graduate Institute, Geneva, Switzerland, andProfessor Clara Portela of the University of Valencia, Spain as guest speakers, while the webinar was moderated by Professor Mojeed Alabi of Osun State University, Nigeria.

Professor Biersteker discussed the threats, application and ease of different phases of sanctions in the on-going Russia-Ukraine war that should be critically looked into. He noted that the sanctions imposed on Russia by the G7 have made the intended impact, citing the case of the Roman Abrahamovic, the former owner of one of the biggest football clubs in Britain, Chelsea FC as an example.



Dr. Portela, for her part, examined the emotional divide induced by the sanctions and gave a detailed view of the arguments by sympathizers of both factions. She surmised that imposed sanctions would elicit different reactions from different audiences based on their inclination. Dr. Portela further explained how the sanctions had been affecting the elites, the common man, and the Russian economy.

The Vice-Chancellor of Osun State University, Professor Odunayo Clement Adebooye, earlier in his opening address implored world powers to iron out differences at conference tables rather than resort to violence. "If wars would be ended on dialogue tables, why don't we share the coffee before the conflict rather than after? Why destroy lives and properties only to come back to sharing the coffee at the conference table after the conflict? My submission is that world powers should sit at conference tables and iron out issues" the Vice-Chancellor said.

Vice-Chancellor Constitutes University Editorial and Publications Committee

The composition of the University Editorial and Publications Committee comprises Deputy Vice-Chancellor (ARIP), Professor Anthony Kola-Olusanya as Chairman; Director of Inter-Campus and Public Affairs, Dr. Obiseye Obiyemi; Dr. Toyese Najeem Dahunsi of the Department of English and Literary Studies; and the Public Relations Officer, Mr. Ademola Adesoji as Secretary; while Mr. Anthony Joel; and Mrs. Yemi Fatokun, will be supporting the committee respectively as Graphics Designer and Web support.

In his response to the Vice-Chancellor's remarks, the Chairman of the Team and Deputy Vice-Chancellor (ARIP), Professor Anthony Kola-Olusanya, thanked the Vice-Chancellor for the opportunity provided members to serve the University through the Editorial and Publications Committee. He assured the Vice-Chancellor the Team would swing into action immediately, and would consistently ensure excellent editorial output on official information and documents emanating from the University.
