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The Management of Osun State University, Osogbo received a team of accreditors from the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria (MDCN) to perform accreditation of the University's MBBS programme on Monday, May 9, 2022.

The team which was led by the MDCN Registrar, Dr. Tajudeen Adisa Bolanle Sanusi, was received by the Vice-Chancellor, Professor 'Ayo Clement Adebooye, other Principal Officers, and top members of the University Management at the University's main campus in Osogbo.

The leader of the Team and Registrar, MDCN, acknowledged the massive transformation going on in the University and stated the main purpose of their visit to the University. He expressed his eagerness and that of the Team to see a more improved teaching hospital after the conversion of the old Ladoke Akintola University of Technology's Teaching Hospital to Osun State University Teaching Hospital (UNIOSUNTH) and assured that the Team would not hesitate to point out areas that the university might need to improve on during the accreditation exercise.

The Vice-Chancellor, Professor 'Ayo Clement Adebooye, welcomed the Team to the University and thanked them for their spirit of love and dedication to effective and globally competitive medical and dental education in Nigeria. He expressed the University's special preference and regard accorded MDCN and the visit, and informed the Team that



he had to cancel his scheduled official trips outside the country to be able to personally welcome the high-power delegation of MDCN. The Vice-Chancellor thereafter provided a brief history of the University, as well as some major transformations that the University had witnessed in recent years. He recalled that the University had initially mounted the MBBS programme with the accreditation of the National Universities Commission in 2012, but the programme was discontinued in view of operational challenges.

The 15-member Team, which comprised experts from various Universities and Teaching Hospitals in Nigeria, conducted the exercise between 9th and 10th May, 2022. As part of the schedule, the Team embarked on a rigorous screening of the University's personnel and infrastructural facilities. It specifically inspected

e x i s t i n g c l a s s r o o m s, laboratories, libraries and other relevant teaching and learning facilities for the smooth running of the MBBS programme.

The Team's exit briefing was held on Tuesday, 10th May, 2022, where the Team acquainted the Management


with some of their observations and advice. The leader of the Team thanked the Vice-Chancellor and Management for the warm reception accorded them, and assured the Management that the MDCN would release the result of the accreditation exercise as soon as all necessary procedures were completed.

The Provost of the College of Health Sciences, Professor Christopher Alebiosu, while giving his closing remarks expressed gratitude to God for how far the College had gone since the revival of the MBBS programme by the University with the support of the State Government. He thanked all members of the Team for their understanding and painstaking exercise and wished them a safe return to their respective destinations.

UNIOSUN MEETS WITH CBN, SET TO ADOPT TIPReS

sun State University met with delegates from the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) to boost its local production and processing of poultry products by leveraging its knowledge and experience along the poultry value chain on Tuesday, 10th May, 2022 at the main campus in Osogbo.

The team of Development Finance Officers, led by the Head, Development Finance Office, CBN, Osogbo, Mrs. Oluyemisi A debayo, along with representatives from Access Bank visited Osun State University to sensitize the University Management on the Tertiary





TIPReS is a Federal Government intervention programme, through the CBN, aimed at enhancing tertiary institutions' research and development capabilities to foster local innovations and build students' and local communities' capacities to engage with the poultry value chain in a profitable and sustainable manner.

Addressing the team from CBN, the Vice-Chancellor mentioned that the University, through its College of Agriculture, not only practices poultry farming, but is also the major distributor of poultry products in its host community. He stated further "we intend to extend our market beyond the State of Osun, therefore we would be utilizing the TIPReS initiative of the CBN to expand our already thriving poultry farm".

Mrs. Oluyemisi Adebayo took the UNIOSUN leadership through the

guidelines of the initiative, and ensured the explanations were sufficiently comprehensive for everyone to understand. She confirmed the sum of three hundred and fifty million Naira (N350,000,000) to be the obligor limit for state-owned universities like UNIOSUN, an amount which can be applied for in instalment or its entirety, which is repayable over a period of seven (7) years.

Having listened to the presentation and how the various questions asked were answered, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Adebooye, thanked the CBN team for the wonderful and very clear explanations. He noted that the conditions were not in any way stringent and that the university was willing to partake in the programme. He reiterated the need for a comprehensive feasibility study and a business model as part of the preliminary requirements for the grant.

The Provost of the College of Agriculture, Professor Patience Fakolade, assured that the College was ready to access the loan, and assured the gathering that a proposal would be submitted soonest to kick-start the process.

As the University is anxiously awaiting the result of the exercise by MDCN, the Vice-Chancellor has consistently assured that no stone would be left unturned to ensure that the University continues to record unprecedented academic and general attainments in all ramifications.

UNIOSUN'S PAST AND CURRENT PRINCIPAL OFFICERS BRAINSTORM ON HOW TO MOVE THE UNIVERSITY FORWARD

...as the university holds a 3-day Principal Officers' Retreat in Ada



Principal Officers of Osun State University convened at MicCom Golf Hotels and Resort, Ada, Osun State to brainstorm on how to move the University forward and share their experiences on leadership, in an effort to support and guide the incumbent Administration on decision making. The 3-day retreat was held between Wednesday, 11th May and Friday, 13th May, 2022.

The Vice-Chancellor, Professor Ayo Clement Adebooye while giving his welcome address stated that the Pro-Chancellor and



Chairman of Council, Mallam Yusuf Olaolu Ali, SAN charged him to organize the programme and ensure that the past and present Principal Officers of the University attended to deliberate on how best to move the University forward. The Vice-Chancellor seized the opportunity to thank all past Principal Officers present for their consistent love and support for the University. He briefly enumerated some of the major achievements the University had recorded since his appointment as Vice-Chancellor.

The 3-day programme, which was divided into three discussion sessions, was moderated by the Director of Quality Assurance, Dr. Taiwo Ojurongbe, and each session was chaired by three distinct individuals: Professor Kasali Adegoke, a member of the Governing Council; Mrs. Bukola Asubiojo, a former Acting University Librarian; and



Professor Sola Akinrinade, the pioneer Vice-Chancellor.

Discussants, who comprised erstwhile Principal Officers of the University took their turns to share their thoughts and experiences with the participants on the following topics: Management of Industrial Crisis, Loss and Gain of Industrial Disharmony; Difficult Decisions Made While in Office; Regrets of Administrative Actions and Decisions; What Will I Do Differently if Given the Opportunity Once More to Lead in Osun State University; Uniqueness of University Leadership and Management; Funds Management in the University; and Words of Advice for the Current Principal Officers.

Discussants at the retreat included the pioneer Vice-Chancellor, Professor Sola Akinrinade; the 2nd substantive Vice-Chancellor, Professor Bashir Okesina; the 3rd substantive Vice-Chancellor, Professor Labode Popoola, the 2nd Acting Vice-Chancellor, Professor Jelil Alamu; the pioneer Registrar, Dr. Julius Faniran; a former University Librarian, Dr. Michael Olaosun; a former Acting University Librarian, Mrs. Bukola Asubiojo; a former Acting Registrar, Mr. Adewale Adeosun; and a former Acting Bursar, Mr. Mukaila Oyekanmi.

Earlier in his opening remarks the Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of Council, Mallam Yusuf Ali, SAN who was represented by Professor Kasali Adegoke solicited unity in management, highlighting honesty, accountability and innovativeness as prerequisites for unity. He further opined that the University and transformational synergy to attain improved unity and dynamism.





sun State University has resumed for the second semester of the 2021/2022 academic session. The resumption, which is in line with the approved academic calendar, took effect from Monday, 16th May, 2022. Consequently, academic work resumed across campuses with teaching and allied activities immediately after a 3week semester break. In a special release to the University and the general public, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Odunayo Clement Adebooye, welcomed students back to Campus and assured them of the University's commitment to ensuring a stable academic calendar.

The resumption for the Rain Semester is occurring amidst the strike of the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU), which has paralyzed academic activities for more than three months in Nigeria's public universities.

The Vice-Chancellor noted that in the last five years, UNIOSUN remains the only public university in Nigeria that has graduated students consistently for both the four and five years degree programmes without interruption




of any kind. According to the Vice-Chancellor, this feat is alien to the public university system in today's Nigeria, where staff labour union strikes have turned the academic calendars of universities upside down.


The Vice-Chancellor further reassured all students, parents/guardians, and other stakeholders that the University, as an entity governed by laws, regulations, and conventions anchored on global best practices, is committed to ensuring academic quality and calendar stability at all times. Hence, there is no reason for alarm about any disruptions that could affect the smooth running of the University's academic calendar.

The Vice-Chancellor further noted in the release that lectures had commenced for students across the University's campuses. He also urged all students to continue committing themselves to their academics as that was the only way through which they could project their learning experiences and justify their parents' continued investment in their future.

Finally, Professor Adebooye commended the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU), Non-Academic Staff Union (NASU), Senior Staff Association of Nigerian Universities (SSANU) and National Association of Academic Technologists (NAAT) branches of UNIOSUN for their unwavering commitment and continued service to the University and for ensuring harmonious labour relationship and convivial environment in the University.







he Vice-Chancellor, Professor 'Ayo Clement Adebooye, on Tuesday, 17th May 2022 called for the inclusion of more females in positions of authority, positing that doing so would enable them to make more contributions to nationbuilding.

The Vice-Chancellor made this plea in his brief remarks at the 2nd webinar hosted at the University Multipurpose Hall by UNIOSUN Global Affairs and Sustainable Development Institute (GASDI).

The Vice-Chancellor began by thanking GASDI for conceptualizing the webinar on gender violence and for enacting it. In his words, "Gender-based issues have to do with the responsibility of each make of human being in the social system, and not only about women as erroneously believed." He also said that "the female gender should play the role of leaders and game-changers, not just beneficiaries alone as doing so would further enable them to make their contributions to national development."

The hybrid event which was moderated by the Provost of the College of Humanities and Culture, Professor Temitope Balogun, had a Nigerian Actress and On-air Personality, Dorothy Njemanze deliver a paper titled 'Ending Discrimination and Violence Against Women: Taking Collective Responsibility.' In her presentation, the presenter noted that "it remains our collective responsibility to put an end to



discrimination and violence against women, and we can do this by changing our social culture and enthroning gender equity in our hearts."

An Election and Governance Expert from the Centre for Information Technology and Development (CITAD), University of Oxford, Princess Hamman-Obels took the participants of the webinar through her paper titled 'Violence against Women in Politics and Elections'. She defined genderbased violence, highlighted the impact of political violence against women, and stated its barriers. She recommended that more stringent policies against female political violence be made, and called for more support for women vying for political offices which had been dominated by their male counterparts.

At the end of a very robust and exhaustive intellectual brainstorming session, the Acting Director of GASDI, Dr. John Agbonifo, thanked the University Principal Officers, the speakers and participants for attending the webinar.

UNIOSUN VC BEMOANS REMUNERATION OF NIGERIAN PROFESSORS

Professor 'Ayo Clement Adebooye, bawled at the amount paid to Nigerian Professors as monthly emolument for services rendered. He stated this on Monday, 23rd of May, 2022 during a radio programme tagged 'Frank Talk', on Rave 91.7FM. He expressed his dissatisfaction while addressing the issue of funding in Nigerian Universities with the host, Femi Olanipekun.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the salary paid to Professors in Nigeria is not encouraging when compared to their colleagues in other climes. "Funding of Universities in Nigeria is an issue we cannot stop talking about. It is appalling that a Nigerian Professor in this age and time does not make up to a thousand dollars monthly as salary, and that is factoring present-day inflation into the mix.

I am not concerned about what a

Professor in South Africa, Ghana, or Mali makes monthly. I am a Nigerian, so I should be bothered about what applies in my country. I believe more can be done to address the issue of funding in its totality," the Vice-Chancellor added.

The Vice-Chancellor affirmed that Nigerian Universities were performing below expectations in adding value to the nation in academic areas, attributing part of the underperformance to a lack of focus. He said Universities had failed to play their roles in conducting research after disasters and during times of crisis, while also attributing part of the underperformance to the lack of enabling environment for research to thrive.

The Vice-chancellor also clamoured for the inclusion of more Professors in the Federal cabinet, as he believed that their inclusion would bring the perspective of academia into governance, thereby creating a forum where the best minds assemble to give novel and feasible dimensions on National issues.

Speaking on the impact of grant sourcing, the Vice-Chancellor noted that it not only gives credibility to a University but also aids it in acquiring state-of-the-art research equipment, not failing to mention the impact it has on the state government, making reference to its impact on the Osun Youth Empowerment Scheme (OYES) he spearheaded between 2016-2018.

sun State University has expressed willingness to collaborate with the Nigerian Navy Centre of Education and Training Technology (NNCETT) in areas of shared academic interest to further solidify existing state-federal linkage on Wednesday, 25th May, 2022.

The Vice-Chancellor, Professor 'Ayo Clement Adebooye while receiving the delegates from NNCETT led by the Navy Captain Aondowase Mnguve alongside other principal officers in his office welcomed the Navy team to the University and briefly intimated them on the University's rich history.

After thanking the Vice-Chancellor for not rescheduling their visit, the team leader explained the reason for the familiarization visit and briefed him about how the Centre operates. He informed the Vice-Chancellor that the Centre is now permanently domiciled in Ile-Ife, and floats four schools and four units.

The schools and units include International Technique School; Language School; Computer School; Academic School; Archives and Record Management Unit; Guidance and Counselling



Unit; Workshops Unit and Conferencing Unit.

The team leader explained that the Centre is looking to expand its courses and more professionally run its schools and units, hence its request for partnership with Osun State University. He eulogized UNIOSUN's model, and expressed intent to adopt its blueprint which has made it an esteemed and successful citadel of learning over the years.

The Vice-Chancellor in his response expressed willingness to collaborate with the Centre, and said a committee would be set up to bring the partnership to fruition. He replied saying "We have great laboratories of computer electronics and software engineering; therefore, this statemilitary linkage is very much welcomed. We would set up a committee consisting of our University and your Centre, to be headed by the Deputy Vicechancellor (ARIP), Professor Anthony Kola-Olusanya. This committee would look into the fine prints of this partnership and make its report."


UNIOSUN DON Bags Fellowship Award in ICLRS

MANAGEMENT PAY COURTESY CALL TO AKIRE-IN-COUNCIL

Management, led by the Vice-Chancellor, Professor 'Ayo Clement Adebooye, paid a courtesy visit to the palace of the Akire of Ikire land, Oba Olatunde Falabi, on Monday, 30th May, 2022 to strengthen relationship and





discuss issues of common interest.

The Management team which comprised Principal and other strategic Officers of the University was received in the Council Hall of the ancient town.

The Vice-Chancellor thanked the Akire-in-Council for the warm reception accorded the team and seized the opportunity to discuss the increasing challenge of insecurity facing the staff and students of the College of Humanities and Culture in Ikire campus. The Vice-Chancellor stated that members of the University community in Ikire were being increasingly attacked and threatened by miscreants from the town, which he stated was having negative effect on the peace and productivity of the Campus.

The Vice-Chancellor further stated "We recently apprehended the assailant terrorizing our students

within and outside the campus, and he has been handed over to the police. Some of the community residents have been involved in similar vices and we have been taking steps to arrest the situation. However, we cannot do it alone. I am pleading with the Akire-In-Council to install a community force that would support the University security unit." The Vice-Chancellor also beseeched the Akire-In-Council to draw goodwill from well-to-do indigenes towards the uplift of Ikire campus of the University.

In his response, the Akire of Ikire Land, Oba Olatunde Falabi, welcomed the Vice-Chancellor and the Management team to the Palace and Ikire town and thanked them for deeming it fit to visit the Akire-In-Council.

The Royal Father stated that the Council had recently called for a meeting with landlords of student

hostels on security, but that only a handful of them attended.

The Council had also asked for the Chief Security Officer of the University to work closely with them in securing the campus.

The Akire further noted that his Council had procured four motorcycles for surveillance of the campus environment, and said decisive actions would be taken to prevent a reoccurrence.

The Registrar, Mr. Gafar Adebayo Shittu, on behalf of the Governing Council and Management, thanked the Monarch and the Akire-In-Council for the rousing welcome, despite the short notice.
