I have great pleasure addressing this august body today. I must thank the Council and Senate of the University for counting me worthy of being conferred with the honorary degree of Doctor of Letters (D.Litt.). By this act, you have enrolled me as an alumnus of this great institution. My commitment to the University will continue to be reinforced in the years to come.

I have followed the developments in Osun State University with interest even before I was appointed the pioneer Chancellor of the University in 2008. Indeed, my acceptance of the offer to be the Chancellor of the University was accepted because of the good things I saw that the University was doing and the way it was going about its activities. That we are today is evidence that some things are being done right in the institution. Indeed , the whole of the Osun State University experience during the past four years have lessons for us, probably the most striking of which is that the success of the education sector today in this country requires the partnership of all stakeholders and that all hands must be on deck.

Time and again, experts in tertiary education have confirmed that for education to perform at the highest levels, there is need for input from all stakeholders. More importantly, it has become clear that our Governments can never have enough money to do everything they would like to do for the people.
