VC RECEIVES AWARD, DEDICATES IT TO GOVERNMENT AND PEOPLE OF OSUN STATE

he Vice-Chancellor of Osun State University, Professor Sola Akinrinade, has bagged the prestigious West African Leadership Merit Award as the Best Vice-Chancellor in the South-West Zone.

The award was presented by the Chairman of African International Media Organisation, Barrister Chidi Nwankwo.

While conferring the award, the Chairman described Professor Akinrinade as a patriotic Nigerian, a super reformer who has transformed many lives positively and made Osun State University a centre of excellence where human resources are groomed for the nation.

The Vice-Chancellor has stressed that whatever the University is doing is about the future of its students.

He made the statement while briefing the accreditation teams who paid him a courtesy visit. The teams came for four programmes: Fisheries and Wildlife programme in the College of Agriculture, Civil Engineering, Electronics and Electrical Engineering, Urban and Regional Planning in the College of Science, Engineering and Technology.

Explaining why the Quarters for principal officers have not been constructed, the Vice-Chancellor explained that: 'We prefer to put our resources for the construction academic facilities than Vice-Chancellor's constructing lodge. When accreditation teams come, they are not going to accredit the programmes because the Vice-Chancellor's lodge is beautiful; they would want to see academic facilities. Whatever we are doing is about the future of our students'.

While briefing the Vice-Chancellor on their exit, the teams acknowledged the sense of dedication and commitment exhibited by staff and the quality facilities put in place.

CALL FOR PAPERS: EUROPEAN JOURNAL OF ENGLISH STUDIES

European Journal of English Studies is currently accepting proposals for three forthcoming special issues: Scottish Renaissances, Translating Ethnicity and European Posthumanism. Scottish Renaissances will examine the foundations, and the ramifications, of two 'givens' in Scottish literary history: first, the recognised excellence of the national literature in two periods, the Renaissance of the fifteenth to seventeenth centuries and the dynamic, ongoing literary revival which began in the 1920s; and second, the practice of overtly linking the latter to the former by styling it 'the Scottish Renaissance'.

Translating Ethnicity will investigate: a) the strategies adopted in representing ethnic varieties of English in written and audio-visual media; b) what happens to the construction of ethic varieties in the processes of cross-cultural transfer involved in translation. The volume will address, among others, the following questions: how are ethnic varieties handled in Anglophone cultural products? How is linguistic diversity used to construct ethnic identity?

European Posthumanism proposes to examine the histories and geographies of posthumanism. It invites contributions that look at genealogies, practices of appropriation, and politics of translation which have been at work in the rise of posthumanism. It also asks whether posthumanism, as the latest stage in the long history of (critiques of) humanism, might even be seen as in some ways anticipating or challenging theory.

EXERCISE MORE CARE ... VC

The Vice-Chancellor has advised all academic staff to exercise more care in the processing of results of students.

The call becomes necessary because the University has observed that some students make mistakes in their matriculation numbers but fortunately, some of such students also have their names written on their scripts.

The Vice-Chancellor therefore enjoined academic staff to take pains to crosscheck the names of students with their matriculation numbers to avoid the errors emanating from such cases.

RAIN SEMESTER EXAMINATION - REGISTRAR ADVISES STUDENTS

As the rain semester examination is approaching, the Registrar of Osun State University, J. O. Faniran, JP has advised students to always ensure they write their correct matriculation numbers in all cases of tests and examinations.
